



Building Career – One Job At A Time.

The **C2C – Bridging the Gap from College to Career** project funded by the Kessler Foundation’s Signature Employment Grant includes the Professional Development and Disability and placement and peer mentoring for students at 3 universities in **California including San Diego State University (SDSU), California State University Fullerton (CSUF) and University of California Berkeley (UCB)**. The core curriculum was offered for 4 semesters to 154 students enrolled in the Kessler project. 98% (151 of 154) of students completed the course and became participants in the Kessler C2C project placement and tracking activities.

C2C Participants include graduate (22) and undergraduate (129) students. 36% (55 of 154) of course completers are available at this time for post degree employment.

C2C-Bridging the GAP Participants - Performance Snapshots

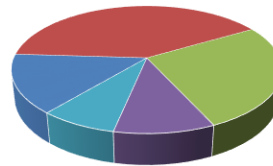
The project team is tracking career pathway activities for the 151 student participants who completed the course thru 4 semesters from 2014 to present. These include those students still enrolled in academic activities and individuals who have obtained degrees and are currently pursuing their post academic careers. For all participants, including both graduates and undergraduates, the project identified 128 placements obtained by 77 students.

- **36%** (28 of 77) reported more than one placement activity or sequential career building experience.
- **67%** (86 of 128) confirmed 90-day retention or indicated completion of short-term career-building opportunity.

55 of 62 C2C participants have attained degrees and are available for placement at the time of this report. 7 of 62 plan to enroll in graduate school. 24 are 2016 graduates who recently became available for post academic employment.

- **67%** (37 of 55) of 2015 and 2016 C2C Participants report career path placement since graduating.
